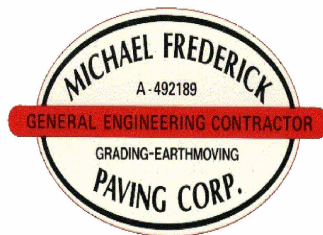

SNRA BOARD MEETING

Aug. 12, 2018

Call to order: The meeting was called to order at the Cal-Shasta Clubhouse by Pres. John Hunter at 9:00 AM.

President's Message: Thank you to Leo Kennedy, once again for his outstanding work in arranging this year's road budget and scheduling and overseeing of all our road work.

Minutes of Previous Meeting: (05/20/2018) were presented for review.

MOTION: Ken Thomas made a motion to accept the Minutes as printed in the May newsletter, Faron Goodwin seconded it and motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: May: beginning bank balance of \$179,503.92, income: \$2,595.00, expenses: \$104,052.46 leaving a balance of \$78,046.46. June: income: \$900.00, expenses: \$558.91 leaving a balance of \$78,605.37. July: income, 281.57, expenses \$171.94 leaving a balance of \$78,715.00. MOTION: Ken Thomas made a motion to accept the treasurer's report, Dick Hart seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

Correspondence: None

Committee Reports:

Electric Gate: Leo Kennedy gave out the gate codes. Questions about the keys for the emergency gate were discussed. Phil Humphrey is looking into solutions.

Membership: No new members.

Budget and Maintenance: Leo Kennedy presented a list of road maintenance projects completed this year. He indicated we have about \$56,000 left in this year's road maintenance budget and two big projects - repair to the upper and the lower crossings. Leo presented the proposed budget for 2018-2019. The proposed budget is based on the current assessment (\$420).

MOTION: Leo Kennedy made a motion to approve the annual assessment at \$420 and to send the Proposed Budget to the members to be voted on at the October 14 General Members meeting. Ken Thomas seconded it and motion passed unanimously.

Fire Committee: Russ Johnson, reporting on the Fire Safe Council, announced that the whole south shore area has been designated a Fire Wise Community and it has received a \$776,000 grant for fire suppression projects. Russ will give more details about the Fire Wise Community designation and responsibilities.

Everyone is reminded that we are barely into the designated “Fire Season” and with the current conditions and Cal-Fire staff spread very thin across the state we have to be extremely careful and vigilant.

Old Business: None

New Business: Cindy McGee presented the Liability Insurance policy for renewal. It is the same coverage as the previous year for the same premium.

MOTION: Ken Thomas made a motion to renew the policy. Russ Johnson seconded it and the motion passed unanimously.

Newsletter Items:

- The Proposed Budget and ballot will be printed in the newsletter for the members’ approval.
- Thank you’s: Jerry Ahrens is to be thanked for many years of service to our community. Michael Frederick Paving for the fine work they did on the roads this year. It was done in a timely manner and below the original bid.

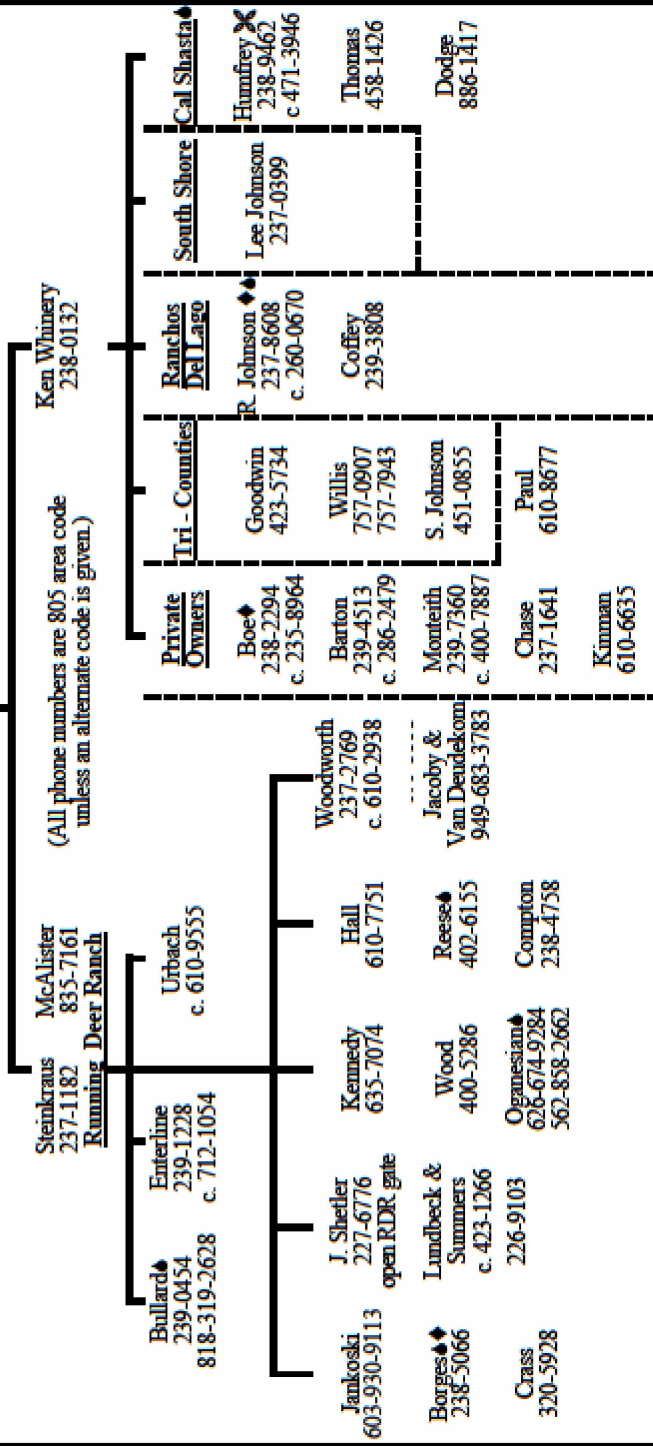
EMERGENCY CALLING LIST August, 2018 See reverse for Fire Safety Information

Instructions For Fire

In the event of fire inside Running Deer Gate, first call 911. Then call one person at the top of the list. If you can't reach either person, proceed to the lower levels, especially in the area closest to the fire, until you reach someone who will call the rest of the list. Or, you can do the calls. If you help to fight the fire please wear closed shoes and long pants. If you are hurt, firefighters must tend to you instead of the fire.

Station people at intersections to guide emergency crews; the fire crews who respond may not be local!
